URBAN CHALLENGES & YOUTH WORK



In the coming decade, cities in Europe are facing big challenges, such as demographic evolutions, cumulative migration and diversity, lack of space, rising mobility, sustainability, (un)employment... These phenomena will manifest in different ways and on variable scales in various different European cities. Seeing that youth work definitely puts the focus on the rights, dreams and needs of children and young people, we investigate which role youth

work could play in responding to the societal challenges. Often, urban centres are hubs of innovative ideas, creative and out-of-the-box thinking and willingness to take action. In many cities, you can find great examples of youth work facilitating positive societal progress.
